During the summer months at Yorktown, a substantial number of Coast Guard Reservists inundate the Reserve Training Center to spend a two week period of active duty. The Yorktown Chapter of the Association holds regular monthly meetings and many Reserve Warrants have attended these meetings. If it were not for Mr. OLDS, the Reserve Warrants who do their two week tour over a period when no meetings are scheduled would never become familiar with the Association. He took it upon himself to hold meetings during these periods to acquaint Reserve Warrants with all aspects of the Association. This policy has led to several initial Association Memberships.






