

# Congressional Update

Congress ended it's last legislative session and the new session of Congress began January 3, 2023, with new members of Congress and what promises to be a lively couple of years in D.C. The closing session, the 117th Congressional session, saw improvements for the Coast Guard budget, and that momentum will be important to maintain moving forward, especially given inflation and world events that will most certainly keep the Coast Guard's budget very tight.

The 2022 Coast Guard budget saw an increase of \$300 million over the 2021 budget, which Admiral Schultz pressed for in order to address shore infrastructure and rotary recapitalizations as well as the Polar Security Cutter. The 2023 budget request was for \$700 million more than the 2022 budget, but that budget increase does not even keep up with inflation costs.

Notably, Congress enacted a 4.6% pay raise for service members for 2023. While this is the largest in 20 years, it still puts military families behind the power curve in an economy with inflation rates well above 4.6%. The 2022 National Defense Authorization Act did institute

a new pay category called Basic Needs Allowance for low-income military members, however. Service members whose household incomes are below 130% of the federal poverty guidelines qualify for it in 2023. Service members must affirmatively apply for that benefit. The past Congressional session was most active in veterans' focused legislation, passing many bills impacting veterans. A full list is included at the end of this article, but the most expansive legislation passed was known as the PACT Act (aka The Sergeant First Class Heath Robinson Honoring our Promise to Address Comprehensive Toxics Act of 2022). This law expanded VA health care and benefits to veterans who have been exposed to burn pits and other toxic substances. If a veteran was exposed to burn pits or other toxins, and develops one of the conditions cited in the law then the veteran may receive disability compensation without having to prove that the exposure caused the condition because the cause will be presumed by VA. This makes getting these

claims approved much easier and faster for veterans to receive health care and disability compensation. This presumption is very similar to the Agent Orange presumption for Vietnam Veterans. More information is available here: http://bit.ly/3XqXZxA

### **Upcoming Advocacy Priorities**

The new session of Congress presents a new opportunity to get legislation related to our Coast Guard passed. CWOA will be working hard to ensure that the Coast Guard budget includes sufficient funding to ensure the Coast Guard has sufficient funding to sustain and improve the quality of life for our members, while still accomplishing the Commandant's intent.

One of the priorities that CWOA has been working hard to pass over the past several years is the Pay Our Coast Guard Act. This bill would ensure that Coast Guard members continue to receive their pay in case of a government shutdown. Although all Department of Defense services continue to receive pay during a government shutdown, given the Coast Guard's unique budget structure, its members do not. CWOA will continue to advocate for passage of the Pay Our Coast Guard Act in this new session of Congress.

Many of the Commandant's priorities include issues that likely need Congressional assistance

to deliver. For example, Admiral Fagan's priority to transform the total workforce includes improvements like delivering point-of-need healthcare and family services. This will likely require additional funding and resource flexibility that currently does not exist in the defense health arena. CWOA will advocate for these improvements to support Admiral Fagan's intent. Several other of the Commandant's priorities align with CWOA's mission and purpose, as well, such as creating opportunities for flexible assignments, advancements, workplaces, and careers. CWOA has continuously remained engaged with Coast Guard leadership on those issues and will continue to do so moving forward.


### **Treasurer**
