I cannot promise any change will come from this but I will be pushing for our CWO Corps to get their Force Specialty Manager (FSM) billets back to full time CWO's to get a voice and some representation up there for the future. In my opinion, we should have never lost these billets to begin with.

Our committee letters have gone out and they are all in full swing with meetings. I want to thank all of you who volunteered your time to be part of these important committees and I look forward to the recommendations that come out of them.

VP of Active Duty Affairs Melissa Polson

Let me first say, THANK YOU, for allowing me to step into this role and represent our active duty work force within the CWOA. The last few months have been quite busy, fielding conversations at many levels, to get a whole picture of the challenges facing our warrant corp.

On August 22, I had the opportunity to engage with CWOPD Class 10-22 during their social at the Coast Guard Academy. At this event, we discussed topics ranging from sea pay for warrants afloat, and the question as to why a W2 is at the same sea pay rate as an E6 to the

"pay to play" concerns regarding reservist travel expenses and the negative impact this is having on retaining senior reservists. The idea was also brought up that a need exists to reassess billet allocation for the SK rating and F&S CWOs across districts and within the various job specialties of the finance and supply world. Through these discussions, we were able to create some great synergy around how the CWOA can support our members and gained several additional members that night. Wrapping up the week, I was able to attend the graduation for the class where CWO Stephen Paskievich received The Chief Warrant Officer's Association "Outstanding Officer Award" for exemplifying excellence in the knowledge, skills, abilities, and professionalism expected in our Chief Warrant Officer corps. CWO Brandon Ingram received The Foundation for Coast Guard history, "Honor Graduate Award" which is recognizes the student with the highest Academic excellence and exemplary professionalism.

In the last month, the concerns about the ESD-releveling really came to the forefront of a larger conversation on the health of our CWO workforce and the lack of representation in discussions that have led to job losses in the warrant ranks. I had the opportunity to speak with VCG ADM Poulin and ADM Mauger (D1) on this topic, where I conveyed the need to renew the 2004 Review of the US Coast Guard's Chief Warrant Officer (CWO) Specialties that was conducted by the Center for Naval Analyses. https://www.cna.org/reports/2004/D0009827.A1.pdf If you haven't had a read on this yet, please do. For many of us, this was the state of the CWO corp when we were fresh out of boot camp and still

relatively close to the post-9/11 environment. I encourage you to socialize your feedback and takeaways that might help build the momentum needed to get a fresh look at our workforce.

In the coming year, I look forward to supporting our collective efforts in building the CWOA and involvement of more active duty participants. If you're not active in your local chapter, please reach out for contact information and we can get you connected.



BRANDON HANSEN

1st Graduate of the CWOA Member Scholarship sponsored by Columbia Southern University



Chief Warrant Officer 4 (CWO4) Brandon Hansen was awarded the Columbia Southern University scholarship in January 2021 through the by **Chief Warrant Officer** Association (CWOA). Any member of the CWOA is eligible to apply for the scholarship and one scholarship is awarded annually. This allows the awardee to pursue a degree from an associate to a doctorate. Brandon completed a Master of Science in **Emergency Services** Management in October 2022.

Brandon retired from the Coast Guard September 30, 2021 with over 30 years of service. He started a position with American River Transportation Corporation (ARTCo) a subsidiary of Archer Daniel Midland (ADM) in June 2021. He is the Health and Safety
Manager for 24 Lineboats
which has approximately 500
colleagues. He also is a
designated Qualified Individual
(QI) which oversees
environmental oversite and
responses for 46 Fleetboats, 24
Lineboats, and 93 Tank Barges
that operate on the Western
Rivers and the Intercoastal

Brandon is active member of the CWOA and serves as the President to the Saint Louis Chapter. Additionally, he is a member of ADM-Vet Employee Resource Group (ERG) that performs outreach to assist ADM and ARTCo recruiters seek and to hire veterans

Legistlative Update

Since the beginning of July, CWOA's Chief Policy Officer, Aniela Szymanski, and Executive Director Michael Little have engaged in persistent advocacy for the organization's members and all warrant and chief warrant officers of the U.S. Coast Guard. Due to the economic conditions currently facing service members and their families, a vast majority of the advocacy has been focused on pay and benefits keeping up with inflation and rising costs.

The CWOA team represented the organization in over 20 meetings at The Military Coalition and the National Military & Veterans Alliance, as well as ad hoc working groups of military and veteran organizations to ensure Coast Guard chief warrant officers are included in all pay and benefit discussions and initiatives. CWOA has been voted into the co-chair position for The Military Coalition's Guard and Reserve Committee, providing a prominent position to advocate and prioritize the needs of Coast Guard reservists within the broader military community.

CWOA has also been engaged with the Department of Veterans Affairs briefings and listening sessions related to veterans' benefits and to provide input and feedback on the challenges veterans have been facing. Mr. Little and Ms. Szymanski have also been regularly engaging members of Congress and their staffs to ensure pay raises, fair housing benefits, child care access, and the Coast Guard Budget.

Congress and the President are poised to pass pay raises for service members of 4.6% for calendar year 2023. The reason this pay raise is so much lower than the inflation rate (which is hovering around 8.7%)

is because the data used to calculate military pay raises lags behind the real-time inflation rates. CWOA and other military service organizations advocated strongly and persistently that this pay raise left families unable to keep up with the rising cost of living.

As a result of these advocacy efforts, in September 2022 DoD announced it would take additional action to relieve the financial stress service members and their families have been experiencing. These include automatic housing allowance increases for service members in 28 areas that had more than a 20% spike in rental



housing costs recently, as well as fully funding commissaries to ensure grocery savings, and expanding child care centers.

This also included speaking with organizations, Members of Congress, and their staffs about the need to pass the Pay Our Coast Guard Act. This act would ensure that if there are any future government shutdowns, that members of the U.S. Coast Guard would continue receiving their regular pay, just as other branches of service have in the past. This has been a CWOA priority for the past few years and, thanks to the organization's persistence, has now been included in the Senate version of the 2022 Coast Guard Authorization Act. In October, CWOA received support from numerous other organizations for a letter of support to Congress to encourage swift enactment of the Coast Guard Authorization to include the Pay Our Coast Guard provision. While the bill is still pending, CWOA is confident that this provision will be included in the final version, meaning Coast Guard members would no longer need to worry about receiving paychecks during a government shut down.

In addition to these efforts, the legislative team has participated in sessions with VA leadership to address scams and fraud targeted at veterans, held meetings with the military liaison team at the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau, and the Defense Health Agency to share our priorities and advocate for improvements. Aniela Szymanski was also recently voted in as interim co-chair of The Military Coalition Guard and Reserve Committee, which will allow another outlet for prioritizing Coast Guard needs.


