Additionally, over the past four years, CWO4 Epperson provided critical support to the Association as the Chief Warrant Officer Professional Development (CWOPD) liaison for all the CWOA presentations, new membership class receptions, and award presentations.

In 2015 Chief Warrant Officer Epperson volunteer to be the editor of the CWO News because he has experience in media design. Chief Warrant Officer Epperson's design and editing skills were instrumental in the successful release of many editions of the CWOA Newsletter. He also reinstated the CWOA Facebook page and constantly probing the Association chapters for articles to bring more attention to our organization. Chief Warrant Officer Epperson has set a high bar for all Warrants to aspire to and his invaluable contribution at both the Local and Association level leave a lasting impact and commendable legacy.
